Still Serving...

U.S. Army veteran and American Legion Post 82 member Rick Maron, along with his wife Carolyn, have been avid volunteers for many years by serving with the Honor Flight Network, Patriot Guard Riders and working with many of the DC area homeless shelters. Rick is an active member of Team Rubicon, a group that responds to worldwide natural disasters and also serves on the Charles County Public School's Safety and Security Advisory Committee.

In late March Rick traveled to Medyka, Poland, once a quiet and idyllic farming village near the southeastern border with Ukraine. The border crossing at Medyka quickly became the busiest crossing point for Ukrainian refugees since the war with Russia began in late February 2022. It's estimated that more than 7.5 million refugees from Ukraine have crossed Polish borders, with the largest number during the month of March at Medyka.

Rick initially volunteered to provide advance logistic support for a UK humanitarian aid nonprofit group that was transporting medical supplies, food, and clothing from the UK to the Email: American.legion4@verizon.net

Polish-Ukraine border, help with delivery of supplies into Ukraine and assist refugees getting out and resettled in nearby countries. It was an international partnership with volunteers from many countries. Rick served in the area through April.

Compelled by compassion for the people he served in the spring, Rick decided to return to Eastern Europe in September to volunteer with three US nonprofits; Renegade Relief Foundation, Kidsave Supports Ukraine and Transform a Street Dog.

Rick's work with Renegade Relief Foundation was to deliver critical medical supplies bound for Ukraine front lines, VCU Health in Richmond VA donated medical supplies which Rick carried with him on the first leg of his trip and flight into Krakow, Poland.

Rick also volunteered for Kidsave Supports Ukraine. Since the war began Kidsave has rescued over 27,000 people and delivered over 642 tons of humanitarian aid into Ukraine. Rick coordinated with Pavlo Shulha, one of Kidsaves true heroes, and was welcomed with a large gathering and meal at the family's home in the Ukraine mountains. Rick carried with him award medals from the Kidsave organization for more than 60 Ukrainian volunteers who had rescued countless refugees fleeing the war zone.

Rick later joined a third nonprofit group Transform A Street Dog (TFASD) to work at their Ukraine kennels, transport supplies and conduct rescue missions throughout Ukraine. He is currently committed to TFASDs mission and plans to return to Ukraine on their behalf soon.

Rick has self-funded his volunteer travel expenses in addition to making personal donations to the nonprofits he's worked for. He states, "I am extremely grateful for the unwavering support of my wife Carolyn, my family, friends, and most recently for the donations to TFASD from individual ALR 82 members, the Unit 82 Auxiliary and La Plata Chick-fil-A franchise owner, John Flatley. It's heartwarming and encouraging, especially when facing tough times in Ukraine, to know you all have my back."



Delivering two USA bound war dogs to a British partner just over the Polish Border

The future of these animals is extremely sad and uncertain, as many have only experienced the streets or shelters their entire life and on a rare chance an animal may be saved. Rick plans to bring home two of these rescued war dogs, that both he and Post 82 ALR member, Randy Markley, will adopt to give them a forever home here in America.

There are many, many more animals that may never get a second chance. With the harsh Ukraine winter ahead and lack of electrical power due to continuous Russian missile attacks help and support is desperately needed.

MARYLAND GIRLS STATE JUNE 18-23, 2023 Salisbury University

It is once again the time for the American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) to focus its attention on our Girls State Program. As in the past, we are asking for our Post 82 family's assistance in the selection of girls to attend 2023 ALA Maryland Girls State.

Girls State 2023 is a training program for high school juniors and seniors. The objective is to provide "firsthand" training in the management of a democratic government at city, county, and state levels. It helps develop civic leadership and pride in American citizenship. It arouses a keen interest in the detailed study of our government. It develops in the participants a determination to maintain our form of government, primarily by bringing them to the realization of how great it is to be and American.

This Unit 82 will be sponsoring girls with good scholastic ability and leadership qualities. The candidates must now be in the 11th or 12th grade. Those that are interested will go to www.facebook.com/alamdgs and fill out an Interest Form and an Application. (As they fill out the Interest Form and the Application, they will be asked about the American Legion Auxiliary Unit. Our Unit is 82.)

Candidates will print their application and *contact* me for an interview. At this interview, they will need to bring their application and pay a \$45.00 application fee (cash or check). The American Legion Auxiliary will pay the remaining \$290 registration.

Maryland Riders Chapter Continues To Serve Its Community

In 2015, Jamie Zayas and fellow veteran Kevin Kling were looking for a motorcycle riding group to join in Waldorf, Md., but were unsuccessful in finding one that fit them. So the pair reached out to then American Legion Harry White Wilmer Post 82 Commander Buddy Hindle in nearby La Plata about forming an American Legion Riders chapter at the post.

Just seven years later, Chapter 82 is thriving, involved in numerous projects benefiting its community and fundraising to the tune of more than \$20,000 last summer for the Department of Maryland's annual Gold Star Legacy Run. That effort, along with assistance from Post 82's other Legion Family members, allowed the post to donate \$34,000 for the ride, which statewide generated \$137,000.

The chapter worked with the Maryland Blue Crabs minor league baseball team, which had worn camouflage jerseys during a military and veteran tribute night and then donated them to the chapter to auction off. The Riders also had a fundraising poker run among other activities.

"We worked really hard at it," said Zayas, Chapter 82's director and a 30-plus-year veteran of the Air Force and D.C. Air National Guard. "We really pounded the streets, and it all came together. And all of the legs of the (post's Legion Family) do a really good job of supporting each other." In addition to fundraising, Chapter 82 stages a Toys for Tots ride in late November; provides support for the Ddamien Project, which provides homes to former service dogs; and hires an ice cream truck in the spring to drive to the Charlotte Hall Veterans Home to provide cool treats to residents, staff and anyone else visiting the home that day.

The latter is particularly memorable to Zayas. "When you see the ice cream truck pull up, and you see these 80- and 90-year-old veterans line up – I remember being a kid and the ice cream truck would come and all the kids would line up. (The veterans) are doing the same thing. That really warms my heart. It's a fun thing that we do. It's pretty special for us."

Recently, members of Chapter 82 were donating their time in Nanjemoy at Lions Camp Merrick, which provides residential camping experiences for children ages 6-16 who are diagnosed diabetic type 1, and children that are hearing or visually impaired. Veterans also occasionally use the camp. The Riders were cleaning up the camp's large administrative cabin, which Chapter 82 took over sponsorship of after the chapter previously sponsoring it had closed.

"We usually put aside \$300 to \$500 a year for it," Zayas said. "It's minor maintenance. We'll do some spring cleaning, and in the fall we knock down the vegetation around it. We've rebuilt the whole deck. We do some landscaping. We've bought a new washer for the cabin. And we'll do more than just that cabin.

"Warfighter Retreat has a week-long retreat (for veterans). They invite us to the beginning of the week for the welcoming of the veterans. And they'll have a dinner at the end of the week, and we have actually come out and played the waiters and waitresses for them."

Zayas said he has no problem finding volunteers for any of the projects taken on by the chapter. "I bring something up, and I get 20 volunteers just like that. Everybody wants to participate and be a part of it," he said. "The vast majority of us our veterans. Some are still serving in some capacities. I served for 37 years. It's in our blood. We see somebody that needs help ... and we want to jump in. And we jump in with both feet. It's really special."
