The work is scheduled for early January. These upgrades will provide better overall coverage for both break-in and fire protection while also reducing our monthly monitoring costs.

Post 82 decided to revive the Americanism Committee. As Adjutant, I'd been asked to manage the Post's Oratorical Contest and our effort to support **Boys State**. These activities are part of the Americanism Committee at many Legion Posts. Our Post Constitution allowed us to have a standing Americanism Committee.



I'm looking for volunteers to be on the Americanism Committee. I welcome members of the Sons, Auxiliary, and Riders as well, so we can more effectively and coherently accomplish our tasks.

Coming up in February is the Oratorical Contest. This is an opportunity for students in grades 9-12 to deliver a speech on the US Constitution. Serendipitously, the Black Box Theater is hosting a play entitled, ***What the Constitution Means to Me***, which is based on the real-life experience of a Legion Oratorical Contest contestant. Boy's State is another great program of the American Legion, as is **Girls State**, which is a program of the American Legion Auxiliary.

Both are now accepting nominations/applicants. For the parents it's a free/low-cost summer camp. For the student it's an experience of a lifetime and an opportunity to distinguish oneself on college scholarship and admission applications.

Some other things that might fall under this committee would be celebration of our patriotic holidays, education of US flag etiquette, promotion of voter registration and education, and more.
