**Chaplains Corner** 

Happy Thanksgiving! I hope you were able to enjoy this annual holiday with friends, family, good health, and peace. This widely celebrated holidays developments and traditions in the US have parallels to our nation's history of which some are better known than others. The first celebration of it is the widely known one that the Pilgrams celebrated in November 1621 when Governor William Bradford organized a feast celebrating the colony's first successful corn harvest and to which he invited a group of local Native Americans, including the Wampanoag tribe. Eventually, this celebration became common practice in other New **England** settlements as well.

The next significant related event would occur during the American Revolutionary War when the Continental Congress designated one or more days of thanksgiving a year. This was followed by George Washington issuing the first Thanksgiving proclamation by the national government of the United States, in 1789.

In 1863 Abraham Lincoln scheduled the annual celebration of Thanksgiving for the final Thursday in November in a proclamation requesting all Americans to ask God to "commend to his tender care all those who have become widows. orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife" and to "heal the wounds of the nation." This date for celebrating Thanksgiving Day was eventually signed into law by Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1941.

As we celebrate Thanksgiving, it is vital to recall what the Bible teaches about thankfulness, gratitude, and thanksgiving and make them a part of our daily lives, not just one day out of the calendar year. By doing so, we can deepen our relationship with God and be transformed by the power of gratitude in all aspects of our lives.

The word "thanksgiving" isn't found in all English translations of the Bible, though it is found 25 times in the New International Version (NIV). Related concepts like praise, gratitude, and giving thanks occur over 250 times in most translations. I offer the following Scripture verses as illustrations of how "thanksgiving" is used.

**Psalm 100:4 (NIV)** – "Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name."

**Philippians 4:6-7 (NIV)** – "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

**1 Timothy 4:4-5 (NIV)** – "For everything God created is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving because it is consecrated by the word of God and prayer."

The use of "thanksgiving" in the Bible, as indicated in these verses, does not refer to a single annual holiday but to an attitude of thankfulness to God, expressed continually through our daily lives by acknowledging God's blessings, His faithfulness, and the abundance of goodness He provides.

The Bible doesn't just encourage us to give praise and thanksgiving for the good things we have received and the pleasant seasons of our lives we have enjoyed. In 1 Thessalonians 5:16 (NIV) we are told to "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

This can be challenging to do when you lose a loved one, have been diagnosed with a debilitating or terminal illness, lose a job, are dealing with a significantly broken relationship, and so forth. Challenges such as these can be especially troubling during holiday seasons, yet we are reminded in **Romans 8:28 (NIV)** "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

Being an imperfect human, I have, at times, found it difficult to feel God's presence and perfect peace, but by His grace, mercy, and love, I know He will see me and others through such things and for that I am also thankful.

With the coming holidays, I encourage Legionnaires to be sensitive to their own negative moods as well as those of the folks in their family and social circles who may be struggling with anxiety or depression, as the holidays can worsen such conditions. # S.A.L. Monthly Meetings are held the First Tuesday of Each Month at 1800hrs

On October24, Gary Shupe, David Quade, and I attended the opening ceremony for Boy Scout Troop 1321 Court of Honor at the United Methodist Church in La Plata to present the Troop a donation of \$500. We spoke with several of the Troop members before the ceremony and they are an impressive group of young men.



At the Squadron meeting on November 6, Squadron members discussed plans for the upcoming S.A.L. dinner and the bingo at the Charlotte Hall Veterans Home. In addition, the members voted to donate \$1,000 to the American Legion National Emergency Fund (NEF), \$1,000 to the Fisher House Foundation, \$250 to Operation Comfort Warrior, and \$100 each to the Maryland Center for Veterans Education and

Training (MCVET), Baltimore VAMC, Loch Raven VAMC, Perry Point VAMC, Cambridge VA Outpatient Clinic, Pocomoke VA Outpatient Clinic, Charlotte Hall VA Clinic, the Children's Organ Transplant Association, the American Legion Veterans and Children's Foundation, Ronald McDonald House, Homeless Veterans, and Troop and Family Support. A donation of \$50 was also approved for the Mt. Hope/Nanjemoy Elementary School Thanksgiving Dinner. The donation to the NEF is particularly timely considering the damage done by hurricanes Hellene and Milton in several southern states.

During the Maryland State Dart Championship held at the Post on November 9 and 10, Squadron members, assisted by several Post 82 family members, operated the kitchen. A couple of long days but it was fun. A lot of hamburgers, hot dogs, fries, sodas, etc., went through the window.

Thanks to Gale Willett, Gary Shupe, David Quade, Kathleen Quade, Roy Yanosh, Lennie Lentz, Carol Karpiak, and Cindy Moruzzi who volunteered their time at the baby back rib dinner on November 15. As always, thanks to those who turned out to support the dinner. Your support enables us to do the kinds of things we do and the donations we make like those mentioned in the previous paragraph. On November 16, I attended the S.A.L. Detachment of Maryland meeting at Francis Scott Key Post 11 in Frederick. At the meeting, the 2024-25 Detachment Directories were handed out. In addition, the 52nd Annual Convention packages were handed out. The Convention will be held at the Hilton Garden Inn in White Marsh on June 20-22, 2025. It was my pleasure to present the donations approved at the Squadron meeting earlier in the month. Including the \$3,450 from Squadron 82, the total donations collected at the meeting was \$23,890. I attended the Southern Maryland Region meeting at Henderson-Smith-Edmonds Post 86 in Rockville on November 17. Most of the meeting was devoted to discussion of the two annual SMR fundraisers, the Drawdown and the Bull and Shrimp Feast.

Gary Shupe and I worked the floor at the SMR bingo at the Charlotte Hall Veterans Home on November 18. Forty-one residents participated and \$200 in prizes were handed out. It's always great to interact with the residents and staff.

Thanks to Gale Willett and Gary Shupe for handling the registration and refreshment tables at the Squadron sponsored Red Cross Blood Drive on November 25. Thirty-three units of life saving blood were collected. Great job guys.

As of the November 15 membership report 121 members have paid their 2025 dues. This number represents just over 56% of our goal of 215. Dues are still just \$20 for members 21 or over and \$15 for dual members and those under 21. 2024 membership cards will expire on December 31. If we reach 75% by the December 27 membership report, the Squadron will be entered into a raffle to win a 55" television. If you plan to renew, why not do it before the end of the year?

Membership dues can also be paid at the Post or by mail to the Post. Because on-line renewal is only set up for the \$20 rate, it should not be used by dual or under 21-year-old members.
