As summer winds down, our first administrative quarter is nearly complete. I'm pleased to report strong membership renewals—63% as of August 22. Thank you to the 506 members who have already reinvested in Post 82. Your commitment makes a real difference for veterans, active-duty families, and our community.

It's been a busy summer. In July, we attended the Department Convention in Ocean City and held our local officer installations. In August, five of our members joined the Virginia American Legion Riders for the kickoff of the National Legacy Ride. Over 300 motorcycles rode to Tampa, where funds raised will be presented to the Veterans and Children Foundation. The Department of Maryland ALR set a record this year with \$235,000 raised. bringing Maryland's 10-year total to \$1 million. Post 82 has led the way with the largest donations in four of the past six years. Beyond the numbers, these dollars save lives by supporting veterans and military families in crisis. Thank you, Post 82, for your generosity and hard work.

At our Installation Banquet, I set a goal for 20 Post 82 members to complete the *Be The One* online training by Memorial Day 2026. This Columbia University program equips us to

recognize warning signs, assess suicide risk, and respond effectively to veterans in crisis. So far, two members have committed—I need 18 more. To register, visit https://www.legion.org/advocacy/be-the-one/be-the-one-training and let me know once you're signed up. Together, we can make a real

As part of The American Legion *Be the One* mission to end veteran suicide, we have joined forces with Columbia University to develop training for those who want to learn more about interacting and responding with veterans who may be in crisis.

After the training, participants will be able to:

- Use the Columbia Suicide Severity Rating Scale to determine at-risk individuals.
- · Identify risk factors and warning signs
- Outline the types of suicidal ideation and four behaviors that indicate imminent risk.
- Communicate effectively with an individual who may be at risk of hurting themselves.

S.A.L. Monthly Meetings are held the First Tuesday of Each Month at 1800hrs

I attended the Southern Maryland Region (SMR) Organizational meeting at Greenbelt Post 136 on July 27. In addition to discussing SMR Commander Jerry Darnell's plans for the year, a motion was made, seconded and passed to increase the monthly payouts at the Charlotte Hall Veterans Home (CHVH) from \$200 to \$400. This is a great way to support our veterans because the prize money is handed right to the CHVH residents.

Thirty eight units of blood were collected at the Squadron sponsored American Red Cross Blood Drive July 28. Thanks to Gale Willett and Gary Shupe for handling the registration and refreshment tables. The next Squadron sponsored blood drive will be **September 29**.

I attended the Detachment of Maryland Detachment Executive Committeemen meeting at Laurel Post 60 on August 2. Detachment Commander Jason Miller's motto for the year is "Sons Honoring Veterans Everyday." During the meeting, I presented the Squadron's donations of \$1,000 each to Child Well-Being Foundation, the Children's Miracle Network, the Casey Cares Foundation, and Commander Miller's Project, Patriot Point. Patriot Point is a veterans' retreat facility near Cambridge, Maryland. The project will consist of building an upgraded fire pit area along with a handicap walkway from the main building to the fire pit area.

At the regular monthly Squadron meeting on August 5, the members voted to donate \$600 to Wreaths Across America, \$1,000 to Toys for Tots of Charles County, \$1,000 to Boy Scout Troop 1321, \$1,000 to Special Olympics of Charles County, and \$1,000 to the SMR bingos at the CHVH.

I volunteered at the CHVH gift shop on August 8. As I have mentioned before, many of the residents I see at the gift shop are the ones who play at the Southern Maryland Region 3rd Monday bingos.
