Hello Riders and Legion Family,

Here's the latest scoop from the Steel Pony Corral:

On Saturday June 25, ALR 82 was joined by Post 175 Severna Park to host an Ice Cream Social at the Charlotte Hall Veterans Home (CHVH). 18 Motorcycles escorted the Circus Ice Cream truck into CHVH and served delicious frozen treats to our veterans. This has always been an annual highlight for the Riders and a few of the veterans remembered us from our last gathering in June of 2019. It was great day to spend time with the men and women of CHVH and so rewarding for us to fellowship with our veterans. We look forward to repeating this event next year.

On Sunday July 10, ALR 82 lead by Brian (Gadget) Miller, participated in a charity ride for Hero Dogs starting at Post 22 Towson. This ride is an annual event sponsored by ALR 22 raising money for service dogs for veterans suffering from various ailments and PTS. The ride raised \$10,500 for this endeavor and Gadget's group had a good time and a safe ride up and back.

On Wednesday July 13, 6 bikes left Waldorf at 0 'dark thirty heading to the MD State Convention in Ocean City MD. Along the way we picked up 2 bikes from ALR 175, Severna Park. After a nice breakfast in Cambridge MD, we arrived at the Convention Center, led by John (Flatrock) Flatley at 1000. Once registered we joined all of the other Riders groups from across Maryland. MD Gold Star Legacy Run co-chairs John Horner and Joe Gladden. presented the Department Commander with a \$135,000 check, the total collected from the 3-day ride across MD. It was a record smashing ride with the Top Donor Award for the second straight year going to Post 82

La Plata MD. The trophy was graciously accepted by Riders Director James (Jamie Z) Zayas to a standing ovation from the convention floor. The Post 82 family raised over \$33K to claim the trophy and Jamie Z threw down the gauntlet by letting all know we will be working hard to keep the trophy in 2023. This was an extraordinary effort by our entire Post 82 family and the community of La Plata for which the Riders are eternally grateful.

On Friday July 15, a group of 11 bikes led by Victor (Hot Rod) Guillot and Steve (Scuba Steve) Meade left La Plata for a three-day ride through the highlands and mountains of Central VA. The ride was planned and coordinated by Vivian (Mamma G) Gedeon who did a fantastic job of keeping 14 people on time and on task.

Day 2 saw our Riders conquer "The Back of the Dragon" from Tazewell VA to Marion VA. Cutting across the Appalachian Mountains on scenic Route 16, we rode thirty-two miles with a peak elevation of 3500' with 438 curves and at least 20 switchbacks. The Riders slayed the Dragon then stopped to visit the National D-Day Memorial in Bedford VA. From there we rode to Lovingston VA to partake of some single malt whiskey and a tour of the VA Distillery.

Day 3 took us from Madison Heights, VA to a guided tour of Monticello in Charlottesville, VA. Monticello was the home of our 3rd President Thomas Jefferson and the author of The Declaration of Independence. All Riders returned home safe after a 900 plus mile 3-day ride.

Post 82 is sad to announce the passing of members Bill Needham and Allen Harper



William O. Needham, Jr. died at home in La Plata, MD on March 13, 2022. He was born in Coco Solo, Panama Canal Zone, on September 9, 1937, to William Oscar Needham and Theresa Bernesky Needham.

Bill served for several years in the U.S. Navy and the Naval Reserves. He was a sailor on the USS Lake Champlain on May 5, 1961, when they picked up Alan Shepherd, the First American in space. After the Navy, Bill worked for Xerox as a tech rep and then sold printing supplies and equipment for several companies.

Bill was an avid reader and enjoyed playing chess, pinochle, and war games. He also enjoyed sailing his catamaran and building and flying remote control airplanes. Bill went on two life-changing trips to Medjugorje, a Catholic pilgrimage site in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Bill is survived by his wife Susan, his son Chris and daughter-in-law Linsey, his three grandchildren Tess, Luke, and Cole, and his sisters, Linda Brubaker and Kathy Foltyn.



Allen W. Harper 79, a longtime resident of the Charlotte Hall Veterans Home in Charlotte Hall, MD passed away on June 18, 2022.

He was born on August 5, 1942 and was raised in Norfolk VA. Allen joined the Air Force shortly after high school. He had two daughters with then wife Judy Thompson Gainer. Allen joined the Charles County Sheriff's Department (Car #31). He later became an officer in the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), working in the crime lab. Allen was very meticulous when working crime scenes including when Flight 90 crashed into the 14th St Bridge. In 1988, Allen was married to Patricia Padgett of Accokeek, MD. Retiring from MPD, Allen went on to work as a US Marshall for several years. In the early 1970's, he and several friends formed the St. Charles Sportsman Club, originally where the St. Charles Towne Center now sits and later the club was moved to Piney Church Road where the Blue Crabs Stadium is now. He enjoyed hunting, mall walking with friends, time with his family and playing BINGO.

Allen was preceded in death by his parents, William V Harper and Elizabeth A Roberson; siblings Thomas Delbridge, Frances Diane Harper and Terry Lee Harper.

He is survived by wife, Patricia Harper of Waldorf, MD; daughter Tracy Harper Curtis (Leo) of Green Sea, SC, daughter Julie Harper of Asheville, NC; stepchildren Dean Padgett (Donna) of Welcome, MD and Traci Padgett Marsh (Eddie) of Mechanicsville, MD; grandchildren Crystal Curtis, Ashley Dare (Chris), Brandi Acosta (David), Trey Harper (Leslie), Brooke Marsh and Abbi Marsh. He is also survived by 8 great grandchildren Travis, Austin, Allison, Emma, Colin, Gabriel, Isabella and Maximus.
