This fund provides grants to needy veterans and their families. The fund also provides training to Service Officers that help veterans get the VA benefits to which they are entitled.

The best news first:

On Weds July 16 Post 82 for the 4th year in the last 6 years has been #1 in MD for top fundraiser on the Gold Star Legacy Ride. The plague was presented to The Riders at The Department Convention in Ocean City MD. The 8 Riders and Commander Hindle accepted this award for Post 82 acknowledging that this goal could not have been achieved without the entire Post 82 family. The Riders are forever grateful for the love and support shown by the Legion, Auxiliary and SAL and their willingness to give mutual helpfulness to each other within the Post. Our goal for this year's GSLR was 235K which would make our 10 year total 1 million dollars in total donations to the Legacy Scholarship and the Veterans & Children Fund. We fell just short raising a whopping 219K, however after the ceremony the Ride Directors were approached by someone from Post 278 Kent Island who pledged over 15K to help us reach the goal of 235K. The MD GSLR Directors will be presenting a check for over 235K to the National Commander on Sat Aug 16 at Post 8 South Boston VA the night before the start of the National Legacy Run which concludes at The National Convention in Tampa FL on Aug 21.

On Sat July 12, 6 bikes 1 passenger led by Road Captain Vivian (Momma G) Gedeon participated in the 12 Annual Hero Dogs Ride out of Post 22 Towson MD. The Riders donated over 600 dollars to provide trained service dogs to our veterans in need. All total over 10K was raised during this event. The ride was through scenic north central MD and ended at Post 22 for a grilled lunch and some interaction with the staff and dogs from Hero Dogs.

On July 7 at 0730 incoming Road Captain Fred (Snake) Heppner and 3 other bikes start off their 30 day ride around the 48 states. As of July 19, Fred posted to our FB page they were at the Grand Coulee Dam on the Columbia River in Washington State. He has posted stops at Mt Rushmore, Geographic Center of US in Lebanon KS, Fargo ND and 25 miles of dirt road to the Northern Most Point of US in Minnesota. Ride Safe Fred and crew you're in our prayers.

Congratulations to Rider CMSgt Richard P. Daniels (Joker) who is retiring from The Air Force on Friday Aug 8 after a 37-year career. You all are invited to his ceremony on Friday August 8 at 1430.
