I hope this message finds you well. On behalf of Post 82, I extend our heartfelt gratitude for demonstrating your support by renewing your Legion membership. As I was preparing this input for our Post newsletter, Donald Trump was sworn in as our nation's 47th president. Putting aside any personal political preferences and views regarding this event, I thought it would be interesting to touch on the Biblical aspect of obedience to established authorities, a topic addressed more than 50 times throughout the Old and New Testament scriptures.

I'll narrow this down to three key related issues, the first being our call to pray for our leaders as directed in1 Timothy 2:1-2 ESV; "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way."

This is probably easy enough to do. We can pray for our leaders' health and welfare, their receipt of and obedience to God's guidance, and their success in governing in a manner consistent with Biblical values.

This next verse, at first reading and without provision of clear context, is likely to take some folks aback. Romans 13:1 ESV; "Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God."

Obviously, our governing authorities are humans not God, but by His authority, and our established

processes, they have been placed in the positions they hold.

How does that play out when the authorities require of us something that is contradictory to God's teachings and His laws? Among other Bible verses, it is addressed very simply and concisely. In Acts 5:29 ESV "But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men."

Ultimately, as Christians, we are called to obey the laws we are subject to, even if we do not find value in them or see in them threats to our established rights. As Biblically directed, we are to follow them, if they do not contradict God's laws.

I'll close with the following quote of Dr. R.C. Sproul, one of my favorite theologians, in which he provides us with a strongly stated and Bible based summary of this topic. "At the same time, God calls us to render absolute, unquestioning submission only to Him. No authority may assume the place of God and demand that we break His commandments. When an authority commands us to do something God forbids or forbids us to do something God commands, we may—indeed, we must—disobey that authority (see Daniel 6). But disobedience should be the exception. We are called to go out of our way to obey those whom God has set over us, and we should not be looking for ways to justify unlawful disobedience."

As part of The American Legion Be the One mission to end veteran suicide, we have joined forces with Columbia University to develop training for those who want to learn more about interacting and responding with veterans who may be in crisis.

After the training, participants will be able to:

- Use the Columbia Suicide Severity Rating Scale to determine at-risk individuals.
- Identify risk factors and warning signs
- Outline the types of suicidal ideation and four behaviors that indicate imminent risk.
- Communicate effectively with an individual who may be at risk of hurting themselves.
